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What is a casual courier anyway?

A casual courier is an everyday traveler that agrees to take a package with them on their existing trip. The casual courier philosophy is "I'm going there anyway, why not take a package with me." To register your itinerary, and become an official casual courier, click [here](#).

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How do I become a casual courier?

To transform yourself from an everyday traveler to a casual courier, just register your itinerary on TCC website. Then wait to be invited by a sender. To register your itinerary, click [here](#). Registration is completely free.

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Are there any fees to become a casual courier?

No. There are absolutely no fees to become a casual courier. Registration is free, and so is listing each of your itineraries. To register your itinerary, click [here](#).

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How do I know that the package that I'm carrying doesn't contain contraband?

Upon receiving the package from the sender, you will have the opportunity to thoroughly examine the contents of the package that you are asked to deliver. If you feel that there is anything questionable or suspicious about the package, you are under NO obligation to the sender to accept the package for delivery. Remember, TCC does NOT examine the package or certify its contents.

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Do I have to change my existing travel plans to become a casual courier?

No. TCC's philosophy is "you are going there anyway, so why not take a package." There is no need to change your existing trip itinerary to deliver a package. You are an independent, CASUAL courier, not a professional one. If there is a package that suits YOU and YOUR travel plans, then great, TAKE IT WITH YOU! To register your itinerary, click [here](#).

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How does TCC differ from other air-courier websites?

TCC is not an air-courier service and is unique from any other service online today. Unlike air-courier travel, there is no need to rearrange your existing travel plans to carry a package, and you are not limited to certain flights or dates of travel. Your trip comes first... There are also no registration fees, and no membership dues. As a casual courier, you are working independently and solely for the sender of the package, not for TCC or for any other agency. To register your itinerary, and become a casual courier today, click [here](#).

What do I say when the security officials ask me, “are you carrying a package for someone else?”

TCC policy explicitly states that you must disclose your role as a casual courier to any and all security and safety officers. This includes answering “YES” when asked if you are carrying any items for someone else. Keep in mind that there is nothing intrinsically illegal, immoral or dangerous about serving as a courier for the sender, SO LONG AS the package you are carrying does NOT contain any prohibited, illegal or dangerous items. So, be sure to inspect the package you are carrying THOROUGHLY before accepting it from the sender, to make sure that its contents are both safe and legal. For a list of permitted/prohibited items, take a look at [TSA’s website](#).

Who pays me for delivering a package to the recipient?

You are paid exclusively by the sender of the package that you are carrying. Your fee is determined solely by you and the sender during the invitation/acceptance process. To register your itinerary, click [here](#).

How much can I get paid for delivering a package?

Your delivery fee is determined entirely by you and the sender. Generally, casual courier’s delivery fees are about half the traditional fees charged by the overnight delivery companies. For example, if it costs \$150 to deliver a 2 kg package from New York to Paris, then you should expect approximately to receive about \$75 to deliver that same package for the sender. Depending on what you carry, you’ll probably earn enough to substantially reduce your travel costs (or at least buy yourself a cup of coffee when you arrive at your destination!).

Why should I go out of my way to carry a package for someone else?

Although every casual courier has his/her own personal reasons for why they enjoy delivering packages for others, most casual couriers sign-up for the money! They use the delivery fees that they earn to reduce the overall cost of travel. (For example, a \$600 airline ticket to London may become \$450 after incorporating the delivery fee for carrying a small package). Other casual couriers tell us that they take pleasure in about adding utility to their otherwise monotonous trips. While others say that being a casual courier has allowed them to make friends and business associates around the world. Can I deliver packages locally?

Absolutely. Around the corner or around the world – You can earn delivery fees during your morning commute to work, or a road trip up the coast. No matter where you go, there is likely someone who needs a package delivered there. So before you take-off, check-in first with TCC... To register your local or international itinerary, please click [here](#).

How large are the packages that I will be asked to take?

Package size and weight vary. Some packages will fit in your pocket, while others will need to be checked-in. It all depends on the sender's needs. But don't despair, if you don't want to carry a large, heavy or bulky item, just say so when you register your itinerary. But, senders are likely to pay more for larger or heavier items. To register your itinerary, click [here](#).

What is the "escrow payment" feature, and how do I get paid with it?

The "escrow payment" feature allows the sender to deposit your delivery fee in a safe escrow account. Upon successfully delivering the package to the recipient, you will be provided with a "pass code" to retrieve your delivery fee from the escrow account. The escrow payment feature provides peace of mind to the courier who will not have to worry about payment, and to the sender who feels more comfortable knowing that your fee is dependent upon safe delivery. The escrow feature is optional. A 5% management fee is charged for this service, and added to the total delivery fee.

I'm going on a road trip; can I take a package with me?

Yes. Being a casual courier is in no way limited to only air travel. Many casual couriers deliver packages on their way to work, during a family road trip, or when traveling via car, train or bus. No matter where you are going, or how you plan to get there, there is probably a package waiting to be delivered there! The delivery fee that you earn could help you pay for gas, hotels, or even a nice dinner when you arrive at your destination. So before you set out on your next trip, check-in with TCC. Do I have to fly to take a package?

Nope. Being a casual courier is in no way limited to only air travel. Many casual couriers deliver packages on their way to work, during a family road trip, or when traveling via car, train or bus. No matter where you are going, or how you plan to get there, there is probably a package waiting to be delivered there! The delivery fee that you earn could help you pay for gas, hotels, or even a nice dinner when you arrive at your destination. So before you set out on your next trip, check-in with TCC. How do I get the package from the sender?

After you register your itinerary, you'll likely be invited to take a package by a matching sender. After you anonymously accept the sender's invitation, and agree on a delivery fee, the sender will purchase YOUR contact information and send you an e-mail suggesting a time and place to meet. At the meeting, you will have the opportunity to examine the package thoroughly in the presence of the sender. If at any time you do not feel comfortable delivering the package, simply refuse the sender's offer. You are under no obligation to the sender to deliver the package until you actually agree to take it. TCC does

not examine or certify any package.

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What if I only want to take small and lightweight packages?

No problem. Just tell us the type of packages that you are willing to take when you register your itinerary. Then, you will only be matched with smaller/lighter packages. To register your itinerary, click [here](#).

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Am I obligated to carry a package when I register my itinerary?

No. You will have the opportunity to accept or reject any invitation that you receive from senders' of packages. You are under no obligation to any sender until you actually accept their invitation, and receive the package for delivery. To register your itinerary, click [here](#).

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What if my travel plans change?

No problem. Just login to your "MyTCC" screen and click on the itinerary that has changed and update the fields as necessary. TCC will inform any matching senders of your changes.

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What if I cancel my trip and I've already accepted a package from a sender?

First, you'll have to login to your "MyTCC" screen and delete the itinerary that has been canceled. TCC will inform any matching senders of your changes. Then, you must contact the sender of the package directly, and arrange the prompt return of the package.

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How do I know if there is a matching sender that needs me to deliver a package?

After you register your itinerary with TCC, you will be directed to your personal "MyTCC" screen. There, you will see all a list of your itineraries next to any matching senders that exist in our database. Any matching senders will also be automatically notified of your anonymous itinerary, and given the opportunity to invite you to take a package for them. You can also use the "quick search" feature in the left margin of the [home page](#) or the [availability map](#).

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How is my identity protected from the sender?

Your personal details, contact information and identity are not revealed to the sender until the sender purchases your contact information. Until your contact information is purchased, your itinerary is identified only by ID number.

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Who sends items via casual courier?

Anyone who wishes to send a package for the **cost** of post, at the **speed** of overnight, and

with the **assurances** of hand-delivery sends packages via casual courier – the world’s first alternative delivery system. To register your package now, click [here](#).

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How do I know the courier won’t steal my package?

All casual couriers are rated by previous senders. You can view a courier’s reliability rating before inviting them to carry your package. In addition, when you meet the courier to drop-off the package, you will receive a copy of his/her picture ID and contact information. Despite these precautions, TCC recommends insuring your package via third party insurance agency or through your home-owners insurance policy. For more information regarding third party insurance policy, click [here](#). (Please describe the contents of the package being sent via casual courier, and its approximate value).

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What happens if my package is damaged, lost or confiscated?

TCC is merely an “information forum” where users with packages to send can meet independent everyday travelers that are willing to deliver their packages. Any damage, lost or confiscated package are ENTIRELY the responsibility of the users. TCC suggests discussing the terms of your independent relationship with the courier, including incidents of loss/damage, before transferring your package to the courier for delivery. A suggested “Courier Service Agreement” is provided in the [documents section](#) of the website to assist your transactions.

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How much should I pay my courier?

The delivery fee that you pay your independent casual courier is entirely up to you. TCC can only suggest that the delivery fee is at least half the cost of traditional overnight delivery methods. For example, if it costs \$100 to send you package to Moscow, then TCC suggests offering your matching casual courier at least \$50 to deliver your package. You may opt to pay more if the courier is willing to pick-up the package from you, or go out of their way to deliver it to the recipient. To register your package now, click [here](#).

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Can I send packages locally?

Of course. Whether you need a package sent around the globe, or around the corner, TCC is the place to visit before sending your package via traditional delivery methods. To register your package now, click [here](#).

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How can I be sure that the package will arrive to the recipient on-time?

TCC is merely an “information forum” where users with packages to send can meet independent everyday travelers that are willing to deliver their packages. Any late, damaged, lost or confiscated packages are ENTIRELY the responsibility of the users. That said, TCC has enacted several policies that will help YOU ensure the reliability of delivery. First, each registered courier that you will find on TCC has been rated by previous senders. You can use this rating information to judge the reliability of a casual courier before inviting him/her to take your package. In addition, you can deposit the courier’s delivery fee in

escrow using the "escrow payment" feature. Your fee will be held in escrow until delivery is confirmed by YOU. Then, you will send the courier a "pass code" with which he/she can retrieve the delivery fee from escrow. Lastly, TCC suggests that you independently insure all packages that you send via casual courier. Although TCC does not insure or guarantee delivery, we may be able to suggest an independent insurance broker to you. For more information regarding third party insurance policies, click [here](#). 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Can I wait to pay the courier until after the package arrives?

Yes, if the courier agrees to this arrangement, you can postpone payment until after delivery. The easiest way to do this is by using the "escrow payment" feature. This feature allows the sender to deposit the delivery fee into a safe escrow account. Upon successfully delivering the package to the recipient, the sender provides the courier with a "pass code" to retrieve the delivery fee from the escrow account. This feature provides greater peace of mind to the courier and sender alike. The escrow feature is optional, and a 5% management fee is charged for using this service.

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Who is the courier that has agreed to take my package?

Although every casual courier has his/her own personal reasons for why they enjoy delivering packages for others, most casual couriers seem to be interested in using their delivery fees to reduce their cost of travel (So, a \$600 airline ticket to London could become \$450 after delivering a small package for you). Other casual couriers take pleasure in adding utility to their otherwise monotonous trips, or making new friends/business associates around the world.

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Who pays the courier for delivering my package?

You do. TCC just makes the match between the sender and courier. You do the rest. The sender is fully responsible for paying the agreed delivery fees to the courier upon delivery and according to your independent delivery agreement. For an example of a "Courier Service Agreement", click [here](#).

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How much does TCC take for making the match?

TCC charges the sender a small matching fee (only \$0.99) when the sender purchases the courier's contact information. The contact information received by the sender contains the phone number and email of a courier that has already agreed to take the sender's specific package to its specified destination, for an agreed upon delivery fee.

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How do I get the package to the courier?

After the courier accepts your offer to delivery the package, you will arrange a time and date to meet. At that meeting, you will transfer the package to the courier. Be prepared for the courier to thoroughly examine the package at this time, in your presence. If the

courier does not feel completely comfortable with the contents of the package, he/she may refuse to deliver the package. You should also bring with you a copy of your photo ID or passport to this meeting. For more information, visit the [Documents section](#) of the TCC website.

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What if I have a very large or very heavy package?

If the courier agrees to take an extra checked bag, then you can send the package via casual courier. However, if the package is too large or heavy for airline travel, you may consider finding space on another user's cargo shipping container, and sending the package via sea. For more information on TCC's container sharing services, click [here](#).

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How do I know my package contains an illegal or prohibited item?

TCC suggests couriers thoroughly examine the package in the presence of the sender before accepting it for delivery. For a list of permitted/prohibited items please visit TSA's website: www.tsa.gov or click [here](#).

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What if my package gets confiscated by airport officials?

TCC is merely an "information forum" where users with packages to send can meet independent everyday travelers that are willing to deliver their packages. Any damage, lost or confiscated package are ENTIRELY the responsibility of the users. TCC suggests discussing the terms of your independent relationship, including loss/confiscation with the courier before transferring your package for delivery. A suggested "Courier Service Agreement" is provided in the [documents section](#) of TCC's website to assist your transactions.

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What if there are currently no couriers available to take my package?

If no matches were found yet, then just wait. TCC will automatically notify you via e-mail and on your "MyTCC" screen as soon as a matching courier is identified.

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How do I know when there is a casual courier available to take my package?

When you register your package, you will immediately be shown a list of the active couriers that match your request. In addition, you can run a "quick search" from TCC's [home page](#) or from the [availability map](#).

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How is my identity protected from the courier?

Personal information is concealed from other users until after the sender purchases the couriers contact information. At that time, it is expected that both parties will exchange accurate contact information with one another.

Who uses TCC's services?

Senders use TCC to save big on delivery fees world wide. Couriers use TCC to reduce travel expenses and add utility to an otherwise monotonous trip.

What is a casual courier?

A casual courier is an independent traveler who is willing to carry a package for the sender during his trip. He need not change his travel plans for the trip, and arranges all the travel and delivery details on his own.

What role does TCC have in all this?

TCC is merely a matchmaker for people with packages to send and travelers willing to be couriers.

How much does it cost to use TCC's website?

Registering on the website is quick, easy and FREE. TCC does charge a small matchmaking fee (\$0.99) for the confirmed contact information of the courier. There is also a 5% commission when users choose to employ the "escrow payment" feature.

Does TCC employ couriers?

No. TCC is merely a matchmaker for people with packages to send and travelers willing to be couriers. The website is a forum for information, and in no way should be construed as a courier agency, or employer of couriers. TCC does NOT employ or screen couriers and can not be help responsible for users' conduct. For more information on TCC policies, please review TCC's [Terms & Conditions](#).

Does TCC hire couriers to deliver package?

No. TCC is merely a matchmaker for people with packages to send and travelers willing to be couriers. The website is a forum for information, and in no way should be construed as a courier agency, or employer of couriers. TCC does NOT screen couriers and can not be help responsible for user conduct. 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Will it be cheaper to send a package via casual courier or via post?

It depends on what you are sending, and to where it is going. But since YOU determine the rate, odds are it will be cheaper to send your package via casual courier. With TCC, you select the courier, and you determine cost of delivery!

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Does TCC send the package for me?

No. TCC is merely a matchmaker for people with packages to send and travelers willing to be couriers. After the match is made, and the contact information is exchange, then it's up to the users to arrange delivery details on their own. TCC does not play any role in the actual delivery of packages.

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Isn't it illegal to carry a package for someone else?

No. There is nothing illegal about carrying a package for someone else, SO LONG AS that package does not contain any illegal, or prohibited items. For a list of what constitutes illegal or prohibited, check with your local authority or TSA's website: www.tsa.gov or click [here](#).

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How do I know if the contents of the package are prohibited or illegal?

TCC suggests that couriers thoroughly examine the package contents before accepting it for delivery. For a list of permitted/prohibited items please visit TSA's official website: www.tsa.gov or click [here](#).

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Who uses TCC's the container sharing service?

Anyone with a package that is too large for a casual courier to delivery is should check out TCC's container sharing service. Users can share space in large cargo shipping containers, instead of renting a full container on their own. This service is an excellent resource for

users making international moves, small/medium industry, and marine and trucking companies seeking to fill their containers to capacity.

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Why not just send my cargo via casual courier?

If your package is too large, heavy or bulky to be handled by casual courier, then TCC's container sharing service may be a good option for delivery. Use this service to find available empty space on large cargo shipping containers, moving truck, or other cargo delivery.

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How long will my cargo take to arrive?

It depends on where your cargo is originating, and where it is going, and how by what means it is traveling. Generally, sea travel is much slower than air travel. If your cargo is going via shipping vessel, then expect to wait weeks/months for its arrival. However, if your cargo is traveling by truck, or cargo train, it could arrive within a couple of days. It's best to clarify estimated arrival time with the shipper of the container in which you are renting space before finalizing the delivery deal.

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Can I use the escrow feature with container sharing service?

Yes. The escrow feature can be used for the container sharing service. The "escrow payment" feature allows the sender to deposit the delivery fee in a safe account with TCC. Upon successful delivery of the cargo to its destination, the primary container holder will be provided with a "pass code" to retrieve the delivery fee from the escrow account. The escrow feature is optional and a 5% management fee will be charged for this service.

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Does TCC arrange the shipment?

No. TCC is merely a matchmaker for people with large cargo packages to send and users with space to share in their shipping containers. The website is a forum for information, and in no way should be construed as a courier, shipping agency, delivery company, or renter of shipping containers. TCC does NOT guarantee or warrant shipments. For more information on TCC policies, please review TCC's [Terms & Conditions](#).

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What company will actually transport my cargo?

There are a wide range of shipping companies that transport cargo around the world. The user that registered available space in his/her shipping container has usually already commissioned a company to deliver his/her goods to their destination, and already rented a shipping container for this purpose. You are merely "hitching" a ride for YOUR cargo in his/her shipping container. So, for any details regarding the shipping company being used, please request this information from the matching user.

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How much space can I use in the container?

It depends on how much space is available in the container. Some users may greatly over estimate the amount of space they need prior to arranging the shipping container. Others

are quite accurate and only have a small amount of space remaining to rent. The listing for the container sharing service notes the amount of space available in each particular shipment. 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How do I know what else is being shipped in the container that I'm sharing?

After TCC matches your request with other users in a container sharing situation, you will have the opportunity to purchase their contact information for a small fee (\$0.99). You may then contact the other user(s) in the container and inquire further regarding the other contents of the container that you are considering joining. In addition, all users of TCC are rated by fellow users after each transaction. You can use this user rating information to judge the reliability of each user.

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Will my cargo be shipped with a reputable shipping company?

There are a wide range of shipping companies that transport cargo around the world. The user that registered available space in his/her shipping container has usually already commissioned a company to delivery his/her goods to their destination, and already rented a shipping container for this purpose. You are merely "hitching" a ride for YOUR cargo in his/her shipping container. So, for any details regarding the shipping company being used, please request this information from the matching user.

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What if my cargo gets lost, damaged, or confiscated enroute to its destination?

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Why should I share space on my container?

Space is a valuable commodity in the shipping industry. After loading cargo into a large shipping container, shippers may realize that they have significant extra space available. Instead of wasting this space, wise shippers offer it for rent via TCC. The fees earned on can drastically reduce overall shipping costs. Marine and land shipping companies also register available shipping space on TCC, to optimize their shipping potential. To rent available space in your shipping container, click [here](#)

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Why not just rent a container on my own?

If you have enough cargo to fill a full shipping container, then go ahead and rent a full shipping container on your own. However, if your package is too large for casual courier delivery, yet not large enough to fill a full shipping container, then container sharing is a great option for you. 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How do I know that the AirSitter is a reputable person?

After TCC matches your request for an AirSitter, you will have the opportunity to purchase his/her contact information. After speaking or emailing, you may choose to meet the

AirSitter in a public setting to review your needs, and judge his/her capabilities. You are under no obligation to hire the AirSitter. In addition, all TCC users are rated by their peers after each assignment. Users may use this rating information to judge the reliability of the user. Please remember, TCC does not hire, screen or certify AirSitters and does not warrant or guarantee the care that they provide.

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How much does TCC charge for this service?

TCC charges a small matchmaking fee (\$0.99) for the confirmed contact information of the AirSitter.

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Does TCC certify or employ AirSitters?

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I'm a nurse, how do I register my services during my next trip?
